If you would like to inch le names of your departed family members, relatives and loved ones for remembrance in our Parish Altar List of the Dead for the coming year, envelopes to that effect are now available on the table at the back of the church. Maybe you can also drop one into housebound neighbours and friends who would like to have their family members included too. Mass on the first Friday of every month is offered for the eternal rest in God of those on our Parish Altar List of the Dead.

### The return to full congregations:

We are keeping a close eye on the latest COVID-19 case numbers in the lead up to October 22nd, when it had been proposed by the Government that many of the remaining pandemic restrictions would be lifted. We are eager to be able to gather with full numbers in our parish church once again. But the news that 26 deaths with COVID-19 have taken place in Ireland this past week bursts any bubbles of complacency. Post October 22nd, should the proposed lifting of restrictions take place, will in no way be a return to 'everything as it was before'. Although the wearing of masks will no longer be mandatory in certain settings, it is strongly advised that we continue to wear them when in church as we all get used to sitting closer together again and to promote confidence among those most vulnerable in their return to our congregation. I would see the use of sanitising gels and the wearing of masks in our Church as something we will be doing well into 2022. Wearing masks in particular is wearisome, especially when we are trying to sing God's praises. But wearing a mask or face covering properly over nose and mouth is an important way of protecting yourself and others. It's one of the ways we choose to show solidarity with one another. The Irish Bishops Conference have not indicated any return of the Sunday obligation. The request of the Church to only receive Holy Communion in the hand at this time of pandemic/endemic remains.

Again, may I state for the record how we in our parish owe an immense debt of gratitude to those parishioners who stepped up and volunteered so much of their time to patiently steward us, clean and sanitise God's house and keep us safe. It was only by their commitment that it was possible for us to pray and worship. Thanks too for your patience as you understood that you could not sit in your favourite seat and adjusted to all the extra demands the pandemic weighed upon us in parish life.

## 'Tap and Go':

You will notice in our church porch that a new possibility of making a 'cashless' donation to the Dublin Diocese is now available. This is not replacing our usual Sunday church collections. It's just another way of contributing for those now more used to not carrying cash and who pay in shops by tapping a credit or debit bank card. You can select one of the pre-set amounts offered or choose a custom amount, and pay by tapping your card or inserting it and entering your pin number. The amount you donate goes straight to our Diocesan Finance Secretariat who split the contribution between supporting the Common Fund (our usual 1st collection, for the priests of our diocese, including sick and retired priests) and Share (our 2nd collection, providing essential services in our diocese and supporting disadvantaged parishes).
