

Christians Persecution Awareness Week of Witness: 22nd to 26th November 2021

Three hundred and forty million Christians around the world face significant persecution in their daily lives. Tens of thousands of Christians have been murdered, millions have been displaced, many have been abducted and numerous Christian places of worship have been desecrated or destroyed. In response to this situation a group of concerned citizens in the area came together in 2020 with the primary aim of raising awareness of this growing persecution.

The Group is called "Stop the Persecution of Christians Dublin 15". In conjunction with the organisation Aid to the Church in Need our group will be organising a series of events and activities during the "Week of Witness" 22nd to 26th November 2021. The activities will include prayer vigils, facilitating people who have experienced persecutions to speak in our communities, distributing booklets and leaflets, lighting up the exterior of Churches in red, coordinating the ringing of church bells etc. We would appreciate your prayers and support for persecuted Christians. Solemnity of Saint Laurence O'Toole.

Today is the Solemnity of the Principal Patron of the Archdiocese of Dublin, St Laurence O'Toole (1128-1180). Being our Diocesan Solemnity, and with our Archbishop Dermot Farrell's permission, it takes precedence over this Sunday of Ordinary Time. Of noble birth, Laurence endured years of being a child hostage due to feuds between tribes before joining the monastic community of Glendalough of which he was elected Abbot when aged just 26. He became Archbishop of Dublin aged 32 and was renowned for his care of the poor, his deep prayer life enriched by retreats in Glendalough and his work for reconciliation. He attended the Third Lateran Council in Rome in 1179 and was made a Papal Legate. He died in the town of Eu in Normandy on 14th November whilst trying to meet with King Henry II so as to broker peace between Henry and the Irish kings. It was the people of Eu who started his cause of canonization, moved by his holiness. He laid the foundation stone for the Cathedral Church of the Holy Trinity, known better to us today as ChristChurch Cathedral, where there is a shrine reputed to contain his heart. There is also a shrine to him with a reliquary in our own Pro-Cathedral, Marlborough Street, at the side altar closest to Cathedral Street [on your left as you stand facing the main altar]. It is a fine place in which to pray for his successor and the future of our Diocese.

A Prayer in the footsteps of St Laurence.

God of love and forgiveness, when I am consumed with anger and bitterness towards another, help me to remember the forgiveness shown by Laurence. God of peace and wholeness, when I allow disagreements to grow and destroy friendships, help me to remember the model of Laurence the peace-maker. God of reconciliation and unity, when I am blinded to the gifts of another because of fear or ignorance, give me the eyes of Laurence to see beyond difference to the riches of unity and sharing. God of compassion and mercy, when I encounter those in need, fill me with the readiness of Laurence to reach out to the poor and needy. God of creation, when I can make choices about the earth and its resources, guide me to make them in a spirit of stewardship rather than dominance. Like Laurence, fill me with a deep respect for the beauty of your creation. God of infinite light, when I have an opportunity to witness to my faith, give me the courage and belief of Laurence that I might serve as a light to the world to the glory of your name. Amen.
