FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT

26th February 2023

THE SEASON OF LENT

LENT IS THE "FAVOURABLE TIME" to return to what is essential, to divest ourselves of all that weighs us down, to be reconciled with God, and to rekindle the fire of the Holy Spirit hidden beneath the ashes of our frail humanity. Return to what is essential. It is the season of grace when we put into practice what the Lord asks of us at the beginning of Ash Wednesday's first reading: "Return to me with all your heart" ([l 2:12). Return to what is essential: it is the Lord... The Lord alone is God and we are the work of his hands. That is the truth of who we are. We have life, whereas God is life. He is the Creator, while we are the fragile clay fashioned by his hands. We come from the earth and we need heaven; we need him. With God, we will rise from our ashes, but without him, we are dust... drop the pretence of being self-sufficient and the need to put ourselves at the centre of things... Now is the favourable time to be converted, to stop looking at ourselves and to start looking into ourselves. How many distractions and trifles distract us from the things that really count... Lent is the favourable time when we can break the chains of our individualism and isolation, and rediscover, through encounter and listening, our companions along the journey of each day. And to learn once more to love them as brothers and sisters... outward displays, human judgments and the world's approval count for nothing; the only thing that truly

matters is the truth and love that God himself sees. If we stand humbly before his gaze, then almsgiving, prayer and fasting will not simply remain outward displays, but will express what we truly are: children of God, brothers and sisters of one another. We have been given forty days, a "favourable time" to remind ourselves that the world is bigger than our narrow personal needs, and to rediscover the joy, not of accumulating material goods, but of caring for those who are poor and afflicted. Let us set out, then, on the path of prayer and use these forty days to restore God's primacy in our lives and to dialogue with him from the heart, and not only in spare moments. Let us set out on the path of fasting and use these forty days to take stock of ourselves, to free ourselves from the dictatorship of full schedules, crowded agendas and superficial needs, and choose the things that truly matter. Brothers and sisters, let us not neglect the grace of this holy season, but fix our gaze on the cross and set out, responding generously to the powerful promptings of Lent. At the end of the journey, we will encounter with greater joy the Lord of life, we will meet him, who alone can raise us up from our ashes.

A LENTEN REFLECTION WITH VOX HIBERNIAE

The very talented VOX HIBERNIAE quartet of female voices and musicians featuring Teresa O'Donnell, Mary Louise O'Donnell, Sarah Lane and Kerrie O'Connor will lead a *Lenten Journey in Song from Jerusalem to Calvary* over two Sundays in St Patrick's Church, Corduff, Blackcourt Road, Dublin 15. THE RITE OF ELECTION

This first Sunday of Lent, 32 adult 'catechumens' will be presented to Archbishop Farrell in the Pro-Cathedral at a ceremony called the 'Rite of Election'. They have been journeying with teams from various parishes and chaplaincies around our Diocese for a prolonged period of time - in some cases, years - seeking to become Roman Catholic Christians. They have been introduced to the Word of God, our worship and prayer life and works of kindness in the community. Their parish teams will have discerned that they are now ready to receive Full Christian Initiation through Baptism, Confirmation and First Eucharist at the forthcoming Easter Vigil. Lent for them is a time of intense spiritual preparation. At this ceremony the Archbishop recognizes their request, hears the testimony of the parishes concerning their sincerity and he deems them 'elect', ready for the Easter sacraments. Please hold them in prayer. At the same ceremony, 15 people who belong to other Christian denominations who want to become Roman Catholics will also be presented by their communities. It's heartwarming that in a culture when many seem to be turning away from our Church, that others are finding the Lord in our faith communities.

THE THREE GREAT LENTEN GOSPELS OF JOHN: In this Liturgical Year A, the liturgy of the Sundays of the 3rd, 4th and 5th Sundays of Lent present us with three epic and lengthy passages from the Gospel of John: the encounter between Jesus and the Samaritan Woman at the Well [John 4:5-42], the Healing of the Man born blind [John 9:1-38], and The Raising of Lazarus [John 11:3-45]. These powerful passages deserve our Lenten attention. Fr Damian will lead a form of *Lectio Divina* on these three Gospels on Thursdays 9th, 16th and 23rd March after the 10am Mass in St Thomas', Laurel Lodge, in preparation for hearing them anew on the following Sundays.

HOLY COMMUNION ON THE TONGUE

In order to gradually reintroduce the possibility of Holy Communion being received on the tongue in as safe a manner as possible for all attending our liturgies, may I ask those who wish to receive on the tongue if they would be so good as to approach the priest at the end of the procession of those coming forward for Holy Communion so as to minimise the risk of infection for others.
