24 HOURS OF PRAYER FOR PEACE

"I will hear what the Lord God has to say, a voice that speaks of peace, peace for his people. His help is near for those who fear him and his glory will dwell in our land." Psalm 84(85):9-10

Next Friday, on the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple, our Parish Partnership will have 24 hour Eucharistic Adoration and Prayer for Peace based in St Mochta's Church, Porterstown. It is an opportunity to present to the Lord our own deep need, and the world's need, for God's gift of peace. Starting with 10am Mass in St Mochta's for the Feast day, prayer before the Blessed Sacrament will continue there all day and all through the night, and finish with Benediction at 10am on Saturday 3rd February. Heating will be on throughout and you can bring a cushion for extra comfort. (Some of these hours will have led reflections. Keep an eve our website for further details.) SIGN UP! We are looking for people to sign up from our parish to this mighty prayer event. Each of our three parishes is taking care of 8 hours out of the 24. We require a minimum of 3 people present for the entirety of each hour, ideally a mix of male and female. Please only sign up if you can definitely be there. Castleknock Parish has been asked to cover the following hours: 11am to 12 noon, 2-3pm, 5-6pm, 8-9pm, 11-12 midnight, 2-3am, 5-6am and 8-9am. WHAT ARE WE TO DO LORD? As Pope Francis said last Thursday, at the end of the Octave of Prayer for Christian Unity: "Together, as brothers and sisters in Christ, let us pray with St Paul and say: "*What are we to*

do, Lord?" [cf Acts 22:10]. In asking that question, we already have an answer, because the first answer is prayer. Prayer for unity is the primary responsibility in our journey together. And it is a sacred responsibility, because it means being in communion with the Lord, who prayed above all to the Father for unity. Let us also continue to pray for an end to wars, especially in Ukraine and in the Holy Land... May love of neighbour replace the violence that assails their country. *"What am I to do, Lord?"* The Lord, Paul tells us, said: "Get up and go" (*Acts* 22:10). *Get up*, Jesus says to each of us and to our efforts on behalf of unity. So let us get up in the name of Christ from our tired routine and set out anew, for he wills it, and he wills it "so that the world may believe" (*John* 17:21). Let us pray, then, and let us keep moving forward, for that is what God desires of us. This is what he wants from us."

THE SYNOD, A WORD TO THE WORLD: FR TIMOTHY RADCLIFFFE OP St Mary's Church, Haddington Road, Dublin 4, Thursday February 1st at 7pm.
