24 HOURS PENTECOST PRAYER FOR PEACE – STARTING THIS SUNDAY, 8TH JUNE Beginning on this Solemnity of Pentecost, our Parish Partnership will have a 24-hour Eucharistic Adoration and Prayer for Peace hosted in <u>St Thomas the Apostle Church, Laurel Lodge</u>. It is an opportunity to present to the Lord the world's deep need for God's gift of peace and justice in this moment of history plagued by the horrors of war. Starting with 11.30am Mass in Laurel Lodge this Sunday, 8th June, prayer before the Blessed Sacrament will continue there all day and night, and finish with Benediction after 10am Mass on Monday 9th June. Some of these hours will have led reflections.

CASTLEKNOCK BRANCH OF CATHOLIC GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY IN ROME. The 1st International Conference of the Catholic Grandparents and the Elderly was held in Rome to coincide with the 25th Anniversary of the founding of the Association. The highlights of the Pilgrimage were walking through the Holy Door at St. Peter's in this the Jubilee Year, led by Cardinal Napier O.F.M. (one of the Conference

keynote speakers, who was educated in Ireland) and at the General Audience with the Holy Father. Delegates from England, Ireland, America, Gibraltar, Malta, Africa, the Philippines and beyond came together to discuss the most effective means of passing on the Faith to our grandchildren. Inspiring talks from Cardinal Napier from Durban, Archbishop Gilbert Garcera and Fr. Lambert of the Phillipines, Vittorio Scelzo and Gabriella Gambino (both from the Dicastery of Laity, Family and Life) and others focussed on the role of Grandparents and the Elderly and on their vocation. The Dublin Archdiocese and the Castleknock Catholic Grandparents Association were represented at the conference by Joyce Dillon, Donal O'Sullivan and John McCullen. The four-day conference served as a platform for spiritual renewal, reflection, and dialogue, with the goal of revitalizing the role of grandparents and the elderly within the life of the Church. Attendees engaged in meaningful discussions on intergenerational faith transmission, communitybuilding, and discerning their place in the synodal journey of the Church. Eamon McDonnel from the Navan (County Meath) Grandparents Group got to meet our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV on the group's Wednesday visit to the Vatican. The Catholic Grandparents Association continues to champion the spiritual role of grandparents worldwide, promoting their mission to keep prayer at the heart of family life and to pass on the faith to future generations.

CRY OF THE EARTH UPDATE. We have taken further steps to progress the designated Biodiversity area - an area that will generate habitats and create a haven for birds, bees, insects and many other creatures. A rustic fence has been erected behind the shrubbed area to stop the destruction of shrubs and specimen small trees and damage to ground foliage that is a habitat for so many species. Parishioners have donated and planted rose bushes and other plants to fill in the gaps at front and side of this area. The grassed area behind the shrubs is the perfect safe space for play. Fingal County Council have created a wonderful sensory garden with over 800 plant species at the church edge of Auburn Avenue green. This is a haven for all age groups and has enormous potential for learning about the many plant species. The Archbishop of Dublin has requested that parishes give over 30% of their church grounds for biodiversity richness - our work is in response to this request. The students from St Brigids will continue to be involved in sowing seeds and planting and there also five parish volunteers. We request your support in creating this conservation area where nature can grow and flourish. We'd like more volunteers to help with digging and preparing the areas to be planted.
