SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD: "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ!" insisted St. Jerome. Pope Francis inaugurated this Sunday "given over entirely to the word of God, so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people". Devoting a specific Sunday of the liturgical year to the word of God can enable the Church to experience anew how the risen Lord opens up for us the treasury of his word and enables us to proclaim its unfathomable riches before the world. Why not use your smartphone to help you prayerfully read a piece of scripture every day? Two free apps I use are: the "**Sacred Space**" app [from the Irish Jesuits which uses the exercises of St Ignatius so as to meditate on the Gospel of the day] and the simple "**Taizé Readings**" app [which provides a daily line from scripture and accompanying prayer]. You can find them in the **Apple** or **Google play** stores. *Fr Damian*

AN ECUMENICAL SERVICE of prayer and music in Irish to mark the end of the week of prayer for Christian Unity will take place in Trinity College Chapel, Dublin, at 3.00pm this Sunday 25th January, hosted by the TCD Ecumenical chaplaincy. The theme, provided this year by the churches of Armenia: "One Body, One Spirit" (Ephesians 4:4) At last Sunday's Inaugural Service in Palmerstown, Bishop Hovakim of the Armenian Apostolic Church said: "Saint Paul reminds us we are called to one hope. Our unity is not only behind us – it is before us. We walk toward resurrection, eternal life, and the Kingdom of God. There will not be an Armenian heaven, an Anglican heaven, or a Catholic heaven. There is one table, one Lamb, one Kingdom. So why divide on earth what God has united in heaven?"

PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL PROJECT "Update" on what's happening! Our biodiversity-rich planted areas are taking a break. The plants in the cement planters and flower beds are now dormant. The pollinator-friendly perennials have been pruned back and are resting before there'll be an explosion of colour again for late Spring and Summer. Soon however the pollinator bulbs will begin to display their vibrant colours. The crocuses will be the first to flower followed by narcissi, tulips, daffodils, muscari and allium. Before Christmas, over 2,000 pollinator bulbs were planted by the 6th classes and a 4th class from St Brigid's School. It was a privilege to experience their excitement as they planted. They will watch them grow and look after them! The bulbs donated by Farmer Gracy were planted in poor weather conditions last Saturday. I'm very grateful to Aileen, Cathy, Martin, Francis and Desmond who engaged enthusiastically sorting, digging and cleaning the ground area in preparation for the planting, and to John who planted about 50 bulbs. We were rained off from planting! In a couple of months the impact of our work will be visible in multicoloured beautiful blooms. The challenge now is to discourage children from playing in these planted areas. The rustic-fenced conservation area is preserving places for wildlife to thrive. Shrubs that were trampled on have sprouted back up and birds have nested undisturbed. It would be very helpful for our Parish Cry of Earth project if we all supported this conservation growing area and avoid trampling on bulbs now peeping above the ground! Allow them to grow and pollinate. A suggestion - read <i>The Cry of the Earth - The Cry of the Poor</i> by our Archbishop, Dr. Dermot Farrell.
