2nd Sunday of Lent 28th February 2021

On this 2nd Sunday of Lent we read in the Gospel Mark's account of the Transfiguration of Jesus. This is truly a unique experience for Peter, James and John, the three apostles who were privileged to accompany Jesus up the mountain. For a short while as they all stood together on the mountain top, the three apostles have a vision of Jesus transfigured. The divinity of Jesus and the glory of God become visible to them in the human body of Jesus. It is an extraordinary moment of grace for the three apostles, even if at that time they failed to fully understand and appreciate the significance of the event they were witnessing. It was only in hindsight, after the death and resurrection of Jesus, that they really grasped the true meaning of it all.

The transfiguration event shows the care and concern of Jesus for his disciples. Jesus undoubtedly knew that there would be confusion and upset among the disciples following his crucifixion. The transfiguration offers them a message of hope. Death is not the end. The death of Jesus is followed by the resurrection of Jesus exactly as had been promised.

Hope is an important virtue that sustains us in the more darker moments of life. As the years of our earthly life unfold we know, in faith, that we are on a journey that will culminate with us sharing the fulness of life with God in all his glory one day in heaven. It is this hope that keeps us going when times are tough. It is this hope that will help us cope with the trials and tribulations of this Covid-19 pandemic. Our hope, as Christian people, is that one day we too, like Peter, James and John, will see Jesus transfigured in all his glory.
