# 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent 7<sup>th</sup> March 2021

The first reading at Mass this Sunday, the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Lent, lists out the Ten Commandments that we are probably all familiar with. These ten commandments, given by God through Moses on Mount Sinai, are the guiding principles for the people of Israel to help them respond in an appropriate way to their commitment to living God's ways in life.

The virtue of respect is at the heart of the Commandments, a respect for God and a respect for people. The first three commandments deal with our relationship with God. We acknowledge God as our creator and our saviour. We offer our praise and worship to God alone. We use the name of God with due reverence. We recall on the sabbath day the wonders that God has done for us. The remaining seven commandments cover our relationships with other people. They speak to us of our responsibilities to respect the inherent dignity of every person and to behave towards others in a way that upholds that inalienable dignity. In whatever we do, we must take reasonable care to avoid causing any hurt or harm to our neighbour.

The Commandments are often viewed in a negative light today, with the focus more on what they prohibit us from doing rather than seeing them as a constructive framework that informs us about how to live more fully our desire to love God and to love our neighbour. In these Lenten days the Commandments can help us examine our consciences. In seeking to turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel, reflecting on the Ten Commandments can point us in new directions and encourage us in our efforts to be more faithful disciples of Jesus.
