

OUR LADY MOTHER OF THE CHURCH CASTLEKNOCK, DUBLIN 15

4th Sunday of Lent 14th March 2021

In the Gospel this Sunday we see Jesus in conversation with Nigodemus. Nicodemus was a Pharisee and a leading Jew. He was also a believer in Jesus. Nicodemus came to Jesus at night time under cover of darkness for fear he would be seen by others as a disciple of Jesus. We read the final part of their conversation in today's Gospel in which Jesus makes three points to Nicodemus.

Firstly, Jesus speaks of the reality of the cross. The cross will be the instrument through which eternal life becomes possible for all people.

Secondly, Jesus speaks of God's great love for the world and for humanity. God sends Jesus into the world to save all people. Everyone who believes in Jesus will share in God's eternal life.

Thirdly, Jesus speaks about the challenge of believing and living that belief in daily life. Temptation is never far away and there are aspects to all of our lives that we would wish to remain hidden because they are not of God.

It is St. Paul in today's second reading who reminds us that God's love is exceedingly generous. It is pure gift. Nothing we do can merit the salvation won for us by Jesus. Salvation is offered to us solely through believing in Christ. If we believe then we are compelled to respond to God's love made visible to us in Jesus. We strive, to the best of our abilities, to live as Jesus invites us to, loving God and loving our neighbour every day of our earthly lives.
