# 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Easter 2<sup>nd</sup> May 2021

The image of the vine and the vinedresser that features in this Sunday's Gospel is a remarkable image of both our personal relationship with God and the relationship between God and his people, the Church.

It reminds us that as Christian people we are connected to God. We do not live or grow as people in isolation. The growth of the vine and the work of the vinedresser in caring for and maintaining the vine are intrinsically linked. God cares for us and attends to us, pruning us, shaping us, moulding us, nourishing us, so that we grow and bear the fruit in life that he intends for us. The success of our productivity depends on the care of God and our willingness to allow ourselves to be nurtured and tended to in this way by God.

Today's culture places a premium on our being connected to one another. This past year of lockdowns and restrictions has brought home to us in a very real way how much we depend on social interaction with other people. The inability to physically be with people and the separation from being with family and friends over a sustained period has been acutely felt by many people.

Cut off from God we can do nothing of his will for us. Just as the branch separated from the vine withers and dies, so too do we die spiritually if we are cut off from God. We can keep in touch with God through prayer, listening to his Word in Scripture, and being sensitive to God speaking to us through the people and events of daily life.
