OUR LADY MOTHER OF THE CHURCH CASTLEKNOCK, DUBLIN 15

12th Sunday in Ordinary Time 20th June 2021

In the Gospel this Sunday the disciples are experiencing a very rough crossing of the Sea of Galilee. They are almost overwhelmed by a storm and are on the verge of sinking. Throughout it all Jesus is asleep in the stern of the boat apparently oblivious to the mortal danger that they were in. The disciples waken Jesus, chastising him for his lack of concern for their situation. Jesus displays his power over the elements, commanding the wind and sea to be calm. Jesus then challenges the disciples on their lack of faith. The disciples are amazed at all that has happened and ask one another "Who can this be?"

This story is one we often relate to our own life experience. There are times when we battle the storms of life and wonder where is God in the midst of all the turmoil and why isn't he doing something to help us. We earnestly beseech him in prayer. Invariably God comes to our rescue and the storm gives way to a period of calm. We know our faith has been put to the test when we reflect back on all that has taken place.

The story reminds us of the importance of placing our trust in God when things are difficult and never to lose hope when we feel we are on the point of being overwhelmed. God is always there for us even if we doubt his presence with us in that moment. If we seek his help in prayer, God will not let us down. In one way or another he will intervene to bring calm to whatever troubles beset us and help us regain our peace. This sense of trust and confidence in God in the face of adversity is particularly evident whenever we pray the Psalms.
