We continue reading this Sunday from the sixth chapter of St. John's Gospel. The theme of this chapter is Jesus as the Bread of Life, the one who nourishes and satisfies the deepest longings of every human heart.

Having worked the miracle of the loaves and the fishes and fed a very large group of people, Jesus and his disciples then cross over to the other side of the Sea of Galilee. The people soon realise he has slipped away from them and they set out to follow after him. When they catch up with him they ask him for more signs.

Jesus begins to teach the people that what he is offering them is something very different. Jesus refers to himself as the Bread of Life. He promises to feed all who believe in him in a new way. Jesus can say this because he is giving himself to them as the bread that will satisfy the deepest yearnings of their hearts. All human people seek answers to the fundamental questions of life and existence and their meaning and purpose. Jesus tells the people that the answers are to be found through believing in him.

Today we are invited to open our hearts to Jesus who comes to us as the Bread of Life, especially when we receive him in Holy Communion. By welcoming and accepting him into our hearts we are strengthened to face the many challenges of life that confront us at this time. As people seek answers to the problems facing the world, we can say to them with confidence, as Christians, that the answers are to be found in knowing Jesus Christ our Sayiour
