OUR LADY MOTHER OF THE CHURCH CASTLEKNOCK, DUBLIN 15

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time 11th July 2021

Jesus sends the twelve apostles out on mission in this Sunday's Gospel to preach his message and disseminate it more widely. The instructions Jesus gave the apostles were austere. The apostles were to bring almost nothing by way of material things with them and they were to rely totally on whatever hospitality they were afforded on their travels. The focus was on preaching the message and the apostles had to trust in God that he would provide for them as they carried out their task.

No business would send their sales reps out today without them being properly resourced with all the information, brochures, equipment and samples needed to effectively sell their products. In contrast the apostles had nothing by way of merchandise. Their tools were the words they spoke in preaching repentance and the actions of anointing and healing people they encountered along the way.

Jesus made it clear to the apostles that they would experience both acceptance and rejection by people. While many would receive their message with joy and come to know the Lord, many others would reject the apostles, the message they brought and ultimately the Lord himself.

It is often said that the best method of preaching the Gospel is to live the Gospel as best we can each day. This is something we can all do. It is, perhaps, the most practical and effective way we can share in the mission of the Church and draw attention to the presence of Jesus with us in the world at this time.
