# 19<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time 8<sup>th</sup> August 2021

We continue reading this Sunday from the sixth chapter of St. John's Gospel. The theme of this chapter is Jesus as the Bread of Life, the one who nourishes and satisfies the deepest longings of every human heart.

Jesus, in his teaching, is telling the people that what he is offering them is something quite different. Jesus refers to himself as the Bread of Life and the Living Bread. He promises to feed all who believe in him in a new way. Jesus links himself with the works of God in Jewish history whereby God fed the Israelite people in the desert on their journey out of the slavery of Egypt. Jesus is now the means through which God is continuing to feed his people.

Not surprisingly many people find this a difficult teaching to accept. It can only be assented to through faith. It is our faith in Jesus that enables us to say "Amen" when we approach the altar and the minister presents the sacred host to us accompanied by the words "The Body of Christ".

Once again today, we are invited to open our hearts to Jesus who comes to us as the Bread of Life and the Living Bread, especially when we receive him in Holy Communion. By welcoming and accepting him into our hearts we are strengthened to face the many challenges of life that confront us at this time. This is especially true with the difficulties posed by the Covid-19 virus and the restrictions that still impinge in many ways on our daily lives. Jesus feeds us with the strength to shoulder this burden and to remain hopeful that it will soon ease sufficiently to allow us return to a more normal way of life.
